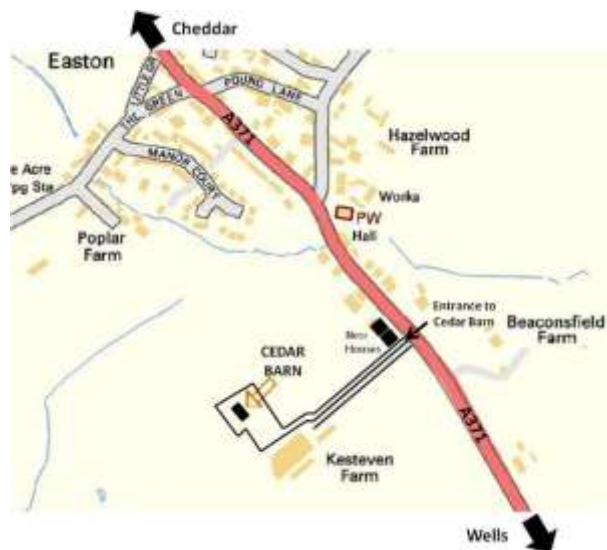

### How to find the venue:

QMMS Ltd is situated at Cedar Barn on the edge of Easton, on the A371 just outside Wells in Somerset.



**If approaching from Cheddar:** Drive through Easton past the church and village hall and start to climb out of the village up Easton Hill. Turn right into the drive by the last house on the right side of the road (Take the CONCRETE drive – not the tarmac drive).

**If approaching from Wells:** After leaving Wells the first village is Easton. As you drop down Easton Hill into the village take the CONCRETE drive on your left immediately before the first house on the left-hand side of the road as you enter the village. (Do not take the tarmac drive on the higher side of the stone wall).

## Synopsis

*Streptococcus* species and other closely related organisms (e.g. *Enterococcus*, *Aerococcus*, *Lactococcus*) are a common cause of clinical and subclinical mastitis in the UK. Due to high shedding, they are also a common cause of spiking bactoscan. This course will cover the epidemiology and management of Streptococcal mastitis.

The course will discuss responsible approaches to therapy, both during lactation and over the dry period. Identification and prevention of Streptococcal mastitis will also be discussed.

Herds can present in different ways and a one-size-fits-all approach isn't always appropriate. This course will use real case studies to highlight different approaches to Streptococcal mastitis.

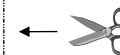
